Personal Study Answers

1. *After His resurrection, Jesus spent 40 days with His disciples, thereby proving that He was alive.*
2. *Jesus' final command to His disciples was to go and tell other people the good news that Jesus died for the sins of all people and was buried and rose again.*
3. *God desires that everyone hear this good news so that they can be delivered from Satan, sin and death.*
4. *In Psalm 68:18, it is prophesied that the Deliverer would ascend into Heaven, and that He did so is recorded in Acts 1:9.*
5. *The first time Jesus came to earth, He came to be the Deliverer.*
6. *The next time Jesus comes to earth, it will be to judge the world.*
7. *From 2 Peter 3:9, we learn that God does not want anyone to be punished in Hell.*
8. *Just as God killed animals to provide suitable clothing for Adam and Eve, so God sent His Son to die on the cross so we could be made acceptable to Him.*
9. *Just as there was one door into the one place of safety from the flood, Jesus is the only way to eternal life.*
10. *In the same way as the Passover lamb had to die as the substitute for the firstborn, Jesus died to be the sacrifice for our sins.*
11. *Just as the Israelites had to apply lambs' blood to their houses so that their firstborn would be saved from death, we must apply the death of Jesus personally to ourselves. We need to face that fact that we are condemned sinners, and accept God's provision through Christ, trusting in Him alone as our Savior.*
12. *If you believe God's Word and put your trust in what the Lord Jesus Christ did for you, you receive everlasting life.*
13. *If you refuse to believe what God has written in His Word, you will be eternally separated from Him in Hell.*
14. *Your answer to this question is the most important one in this notebook. We encourage you to think it through carefully and honestly. And we pray that your answer is, "Yes! I trust in Christ as my Savior!"*
